## A Report Card To Be Proud Of

*The Mission of the Corbett School District is to foster intellectual development, social awareness and civic responsibility among the members of our school community.*

Our mission is unchanged. The economy is increasing the level of difficulty to continually meet the challenge, but we are not giving an inch.

Today a news crew from FOX NEWS is visiting to interview the Corbett Academic Decathlon Team. The team won a state championship for the second consecutive year and then proved themselves at the national competition by earning Oregon's first (in 28 years!) ever National Gold Medal. Lara Dunton achieved this in the Language and Literature competition where she tied with, among others, a two-time national champion. Lara had four top-ten finishes and Jacy Clare, Tyler Jones (both in math) and Morgon Purvine each placed in the top ten in their competitions. Jacy and Tyler placed 5th and 6th, respectively, and Morgon, for the second consecutive year, finished fourth in the Interview competition. The Corbett team finished 27th in the nation, but more importantly they established that they can compete at the very highest levels. FOX NEWS has said that the story will air on Friday. We will try to get a clip for the website.

Yesterday we got word from *Newsweek.com* that they are hiring a local producer to shoot some footage and conduct some interviews at Corbett High School in preparation for the release of the America's Top 100 High School edition later this month. They want to feature the Corbett program, among others, as producing tremendous results from somewhat unique circumstances. There are very few small, rural, community schools on the list. We think that we may be ranked among the top 10 in the nation this year, and it is gratifying to see someone (anyone!) express a strong interest in what we do at Corbett School.

All of this national attention was generated by our activities last year, when we attempted about 325 exams. This year we are doing closer to 530, so we believe that our standing is pretty secure for another year.

## President's Message

### A PLAN FOR GIVING \$100,000 (Confessions of a Philanthropist)

It was July 2006 when I learned of the scholastic achievements at CHS. My Class of 1956 was celebrating its 50<sup>th</sup> Reunion with a banquet in the school cafeteria when Superintendent Bob Dunton held my attention as he told us of the school's emphasis on academic excellence. My alma mater was being hailed as "One of the best, small public high schools in America!"

I was impressed with his story and wanted to help out. In the months following the reunion weekend, I researched both the financial problems of the school and solutions to financially support it. I learned of staff reductions, increasing AP expenses, reduced state funding, failed bond measures, abandoned classroom needs, climbing student fees, a proposed levy and a myriad of other financial hurdles. In the process, it became evident that *the need for financial help far exceeded my ability to provide that much assistance.*

Founding the CORBETT ALUMNI ASSOCIATION provided the solution for contributing financial help to the school. Then I could answer the following questions:

1. Who should the check be made out to? CORBETT ALUMNI ASSOCIATION. Its mission statement, "*The CAA strives to reconnect our graduates through alumni events and to support the further development of our alma mater for a new generation of students,*" coincides with mine.
2. How much should I give? CAA has neither membership dues nor giving guidelines, but

instead relies on the loyalty and generosity of its alums to support the mission. I have to look at our household budget to determine how much can be given. As with all charitable contributions, I reserve the right to give more (or less) in the future, as circumstances dictate. Because the key word is *GIVE*, my contributions are voluntary and I can give with a cheerful heart.

3. How often should I write a check? Although CAA has an Annual Fund Campaign that is launched in the fall, it offers other opportunities to contribute with each issue of its newsletter, *The Corbett Quarterly*. The Annual Fund Campaign provides information on specific projects that CAA will support with the alumni contributions. I plan to use the newsletter as a reminder to keep my alma mater on our regular charitable giving list and to retain the privilege of making flexible contributions.
4. Where does the \$100,000 come from? After I have done my part, I'm counting on you to do yours, if you share this vision. The load is much lighter when we work together. \$100,000 each year is not that big of a challenge for the 1000+ alums who are reading this letter. As CAA finishes its second year, financial records show that the average contribution is about \$100, some more than that and many less.

**If you haven't already decided to contribute, I urge you to join your classmates and me in supporting our alma mater in meeting its many financial challenges. Become a player, instead of a spectator. An investment in CAA will make everyone happy!**

## FROM THE CHS ARCHIVES

Excerpts from *CORBETT NOW* and *COLUMBIAN THEN*

**EIGHTY YEARS AGO.** The faculty included P.J. Mulkey, Principal; L.M. Emerson; Pauline Remington; Joseph Finley; Margarette Williams and Harriette Thomas. Eugene Chamberlain presided over the student body as its President and Lynn Woodward served as Editor of the *Cohimore*. The boys' basketball team took the Multnomah County Championship and the girls' team "did not have a winning record." Carl Etling became a Judge of the District Court and, in 1961, was chosen president of the Oregon Division of the Izaak Walton League of America. The Class of 1929 had fifteen graduates.

**SIXTY YEARS AGO.** Principal Leslie Emerson greeted a student body of approximately 81 students. Walter Vockert was elected Student Body President and Clarence Mershon was Editor of the *Cohimore*. The boys' basketball team under Coach Jackson had an excellent record of 20-3 until tournament play, but lost both games in tourney action. The Rally Squad included Flora Davis and Joan Ellis. On Senior Skip Day the class traveled to Seaside where Jim Rhodes took everyone willing up for a ride in an airplane. There were 14 graduates in the Class of 1949.

**FORTY YEARS AGO.** The '69 *Cohimore* was dedicated to the memory of Mr. Arthur Hiemstra, former Superintendent. The Student Body President was Mark Gomez, Arlene Uyetake was Editor-in-Chief of the *Cardinal*, while Chris Dunlap fulfilled that role for the *Cohimore*. Two students, Carl Thornfeldt and Arlene Uyetake, shared the honors as class co-Valedictorians, while Elizabeth Perry was Salutatorian. There were 40 graduates in the Class of 1969. The football team took the State championship with a record of 9-0-1. The wrestling team also had a good year, with two wrestlers, Gordon Canzler and Bill Knapp, taking State championships in their weight classes.

**TWENTY YEARS AGO.** Students elected Aaron Hoffman Student Body President. Nicole Gathman and Mike Lee were responsible for the *Cohimore* and *Cardinal*, respectively. Nicole was also named class Valedictorian while Nikki Sandlin and Aaron Hoffman were co-Salutatorians. For an unprecedented third consecutive year, the girls' volleyball team, coached by Debbie Swoboda, took the state championship. The Class of 1989 had 59 graduates.

I was stationed in Texas, where I met the love of my life. Virginia and I celebrated our 65<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary in August, 2008. We had three kids and three grandkids. All graduated from Corbett. We had a dairy farm in Latourell until we sold it to the State and I went to work for the State Parks. I worked at Rooster Rock and spent three years working at Detroit Lake. After retirement, we traveled with our 5<sup>th</sup> wheel trailer for twenty years, from Key West to Alaska. We now live in Pine Hollow."

**ELAINE COLLINS DAWSON** sighs, "As you can see the Postal Department mangled the *Corbett Quarterly*. I have included my address and a check. I didn't know there was even an Alumni organization. Please send me another copy of the *Corbett Quarterly*. In 1939 we did not have money to have a proper school annual so we used pink and blue construction paper for covers. Pink paper was used for a cut-out of a sail boat and was pasted on a blue sheet of construction paper. There were 28 students in the class. Included in the *Cohimore* were pages for the following: Student names, 25 years of school history, class history, class prophecy, a chart depicting name of student, nickname, favorite pastime, most-used expression, expressed desire and class will. This was all produced on Ditto (I think) mats. Advertisements included: P. D. Settlemier Red and White Store, Bakers Service Station, A.W. Metzger & Co., W.A. Mishey Gen. Mds., Arsons Garage, Groce's Grocery, Shelly's Cash Feed & Seed, L.H. Arneson and a page for Autographs. These were given to students, teachers and councilors. Blanche Settlemier was valedictorian, Maurice McKay was salutatorian. I was editor of the *Cohimore*. Allan Baker and I shared the Citizenship Cup."

**MARMIE CHAMBERLAIN SNOOK** reports on her class reunion plans, "Things seem to be looking up as far as finding other graduates from my Class of '39. At first I thought Floyd Bates and I were the only ones, but then I saw a picture of Leke Nakashameda in the paper (he was in the squadron of Japanese that fought with the Americans)—then I got a call from Elaine Collins Dawson from Florida. She won't be able to come because of hip surgery. I called the number in the phone book for Leke and his son was sure his dad would like to get together, but his wife had just passed away. He would get in touch with me later. Floyd said he would like to come, so I guess we're making progress. I told you on the phone that I had seen Eileen Frommelt Mollet's obituary in the paper around the 1<sup>st</sup> of March. She was living in Maryland. Actually everyone I've talked to seems delighted with the idea of us getting together. We haven't decided when we'll get together yet, or what we will do. See what you've started? It takes someone like you to get us out of our old ruts. Thank you!"

**HERB SALZMAN** reminisces, "Dear Friends: I am not a graduate of Corbett High School but my family and I have long been associated with this school. Starting with my granddad, Fred N. Lasley, who was among the delegation that lobbied the Oregon Legislature for an enabling law so small school districts could form Union High School Districts. Corbett was Multnomah County District #1. My mother, Clara (Lasley) Salzman was the first graduate, Class of 1916. My Dad, Albert G. Salzman, was the school board clerk when the first building burned in 1923. His name is on the cornerstone of the second building (I think it is now the middle school). My sister, Marian Salzman graduated with the Class of 1936. I attended CHS one year, 1937-38. I know live at Beaverton Lodge, a retirement residence. I still think of Corbett as home even though I haven't lived there since 1946. When we lived at Corbett we lived directly across the highway from CHS."
