2008-2009: A Busy and Successful Year at CHS

Here is a look at some of the highlights from the 2008-2009 school year that make Corbett High School one of the elite public high schools in the nation:

* **Corbett High School's Academic Decathlon team repeated as State Champions this year and traveled, with the help of a grant from Corbett Alumni Association, to Memphis, Tennessee, for the national competition.**

* **Senior Lara Dunton, who repeated as Oregon's top scorer at nationals, capped her Decathlon career with a national Gold Medal** in the Language and Literature event where she matched the high score for all divisions.

* **Members of Corbett High School's Graduating Class of 2009 took over 300 Advanced Placement exams during their high school careers**, averaging more than nine per graduating senior. The next highest ranked Oregon high schools are South Eugene, No. 551, with 2.1 AP exams per graduate and Portland's Lincoln High School, No. 625, with 2 AP exams per graduate.

* **Corbett High School received a #8 ranking in Newsweek Magazine's annual survey of the nation's top public high schools.** Principal Randy Trani said Corbett High's rank is unusual because "We are a neighborhood school serving all students in the rural Multnomah County district. Most other schools in the Top 10 are magnets that serve a select group, such as Dallas' School for the Talented and Gifted, which placed first."

AP Exams Bottom Line: A Very Good Investment!

Academic success does not come without a price. The Corbett School District has committed to giving every student the very best course offerings to prepare them for life after graduation. **Principal Randy Trani** reviewed the financial details of the AP

program at Corbett with the following memo:

The cost for an AP exam plus the \$8 per kid for lunch and the testing facility is right at \$80 per kid per test. We gave 524 AP exams last year. The State of Oregon did provide some help, paying for exams taken by kids who were on free and reduced lunch, about 100 tests. We still paid for lunch and the testing facility for the free and reduced lunch kids. Thanks for the continued support!

Superintendent Bob Dunton put the large AP expenditure into perspective by showing the benefits that students gain by taking, and passing, the college-level courses:

The Class of 2009 earned the equivalent of 10 full-time years' worth of college credit (465 credit hours) had they submitted all of their passing scores to Oregon State University. Another way to look at it would be to say that they passed an average of three college classes each, for the entire class!

The cost of tuition, room and board for students earning these credits through attendance at OSU: over \$20,000. That's a 10:1 return on our investment in them.

Thanks to the Corbett Alumni Association for its contribution toward making Advanced Placement Exams available at no cost to every Corbett Student. That's a pretty powerful scholarship program. And the students earned every dollar through their hard work and dedication.

President's Message

In reviewing the accomplishments of 2008-2009, I couldn't help but wonder if the "**daring adventures**" at Corbett were the special ingredient that resulted in another outstanding report card, for both the school and its alums. Here are some of my findings:

- Because of the mid-year state budget crisis, the school district imposed a "Spending Freeze" until the end of the year. **Newsweek magazine ranked CHS #8 in the nation and the top high school in Oregon for the past two years.**
- AP courses are designed to be more rigorous than traditional high school courses and can earn students college credit. Most school districts offer Advanced Placement (AP) courses to some students, but the students usually pay to take the AP exam. **AP courses are available at no cost to every Corbett student. Corbett gave 524 AP exams last year, at a cost of \$80 per test.**
- The cost of attending college continues to climb. **The Class of 2009 passed an average of three college classes each for the entire class! That's money he or she won't have to spend on college tuition. Some students have earned enough credit to forego their freshman year, saving them and their parents money.**
- **Corbett Alumni Association** encourages and supports class

reunions every five years. Class rosters, mailing labels, publicity and Reunion Planning Workshops are offered. **Nine out of fourteen classes planned and held reunions in 2009.**

- Finding classmates is an ongoing challenge and unusual research techniques are often needed. **CAA's database grew by 34% last year to 1115.**
- The bad economy has affected all of us. **Alumni participation in the Annual Fund Campaign was up 95%, contributions increased 38% and grants made to CHS were increased by 50%.**

Life at Corbett High School and with the *Corbett Alumni Association* was truly a **daring adventure** last year. **Join me as we begin another one.** I promise you won't be bored!

From the CHS Archives

Excerpts from *CORBETT NOW AND COLUMBIAN THEN*

SEVENTY FIVE YEARS AGO. The faculty included Mr. P.J. Mulkey, Mr. Emerson, Miss McEntire, Miss Poor and Miss Rosen. Arthur Rich was elected Student Body President the previous spring. There were twenty-one students in the Class of 1935.

FIFTY FIVE YEARS AGO. A new administrator, Mr. Raymond "Pat" Brown, was named to replace Mr. Emerson. Board action made Mr. Brown Superintendent, with Mr. Reed serving as Assistant Superintendent. Mr. Brown also served as Principal of Columbian High. A staff of six teachers served with Mr. Brown: Mrs. Elsie Clements, Mr. Ben Goodling, Mr. William Nelson, Mrs. Joy Perry, Mr. Arthur Verment and Mrs. Patricia Warren. Helen Post held the position of administrative secretary. Charlene Kogle served as Student Body President. Jim Berney edited the school annual while Donna Peterson performed that role for the *Cardinal*. Columbian High's football team had a record of 2-4 in its initial season and introduced a "new" sport to Columbian High. The basketball team under Coach Verment had an excellent season, with a record of 21-4. Construction of the new gymnasium was completed during the 1954-55 school year. **The Board of Directors of District #39 voted to change the name of the high school from Columbian High School to Corbett High School.** Thus, the Class of 1955 was the last class to graduate from "Columbian" High School.

THIRTY FIVE YEARS AGO. The administrative staff of Mr. Earle Schafer, Superintendent, and Mr. Alvin Giebrecht, Principal, returned with a teaching staff of eighteen teachers. Working in the administrative offices were Secretary Dona Layton, Assistant Clerk Dorothy Westmoreland and the Principal's Assistant, Mrs. Pat Lucas. Charles Tarpley was elected Student Body President, Lori Dunlap directed the *Cardinal* staff and Juanita Graff served as editor of the *Cohimore*. The Class of 1975 had 34 students.

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO. The staff was directed by Mr. Larry McClellan, Superintendent, and included Mr. Jim Kuhlmann, Principal, Pat Bourgo, Bob Schaefer and Marcia Wynn, administrative and counseling staff. Student Body President Jon Franz served as student leader for the year. The *Cohimore* had co-editors, Megan Richardson and Desiree Somner. Nathan Taylor earned the honor of being named class Valedictorian. He was also named a National Merit Commended Scholar, Oregon and Tandy Scholar. Desiree Somner was named Salutatorian and received a \$25,000 scholarship to George Fox College.
